Student Learning Outcomes Annual Report 2007-2008

1. **Program-Department:**

CalWORKs

2. **Program-Department Mission Statement:**

The CalWORKs program responds to the needs and concerns of socio-economically challenged students with dependent children (receiving or eligible for cashaid) by providing specialized counseling, instructional and support services to help insure their achievement of educational goals and career readiness. Ultimately, CalWORKs program assists participant's transition from dependency upon cash aid and related services to realizing economic independence as viable members of the workforce.

3. **Student Learning Outcomes:**

As a result of participating in a CalWORKs counseling session:

- The student will be able to demonstrate the ability to calculate his/her 32-hour requirement of education and work-study activities.

4. **Methods**

a. **With criteria for each outcome:** Students needed to be able to complete a form known as the Education/Employment Agreement, which demonstrates their ability to calculate 32 hours of education and work-study activities.

5. **Implementation of Assessment Process: Who? How? When?**

a. **Identify who is responsible for doing each step in the evaluation process (list all of the individuals involved in the assessment process).**

- The CalWORKs Counselor was responsible for explaining the form, to be completed by the students and observing the students complete the form.

b. **Outline the timeline for implementation:**

The timeline for the CalWORKs program was Spring 2008.

c. **Identify who will be evaluated:**

CalWORKs students who are participating in the Welfare to Work Program and are required to complete 32 hours per week of approved activities.

d. **Identify other programs who are assisting with the evaluation:**

No other programs are assisting with the evaluation.

e. **Identify who is the intended user of the data that will be collected:**

The SCC CalWORKs program will use this data to evaluate the success/completion of the student learning outcome.

6. **Results**

a. **Summarize the results for each outcome**

- 100% of the 23 CalWORKs students were able to complete the Education/Employment Agreement and calculate the required hours.
- Since students completed the Education/Employment Agreement during counseling appointments, the CalWORKs counselor was able to answer questions regarding student employment goal, certificate/training program, and estimated completion date.
- All of the 23 CalWORKs students, who completed the Education/Employment Agreement, were able to calculate the 32 hours of education and work-study activities.

b. **Summarize the process to verify/validate the results**

- The process to validate the student learning outcome assessment was through the counselor one-on-one observation. The process included the counselor explaining the requirement and the form to be filled out.
- The counselor verified that the total number of hours equaled 32.
- The counselor observed students' ability to complete the form.

7. **Decisions and Recommendations**

a. **Summarize the decisions/recommendations made for each outcome**

The current student learning outcome will continue for the 2008-2009 academic year.

The group who participated in this discussion included the Director of EOPS/CARE/CalWORKs and the CalWORKs counselor.

The CalWORKs counselor will improve the Education/Employment Agreement by simplifying the section regarding the students' student employment goals, certificate/training programs, and estimated completion date.

Student Learning Outcomes will be assessed in Spring 2009.
