L. Aguilera	II.b.	Articulation Officer Report	<p>The CSU Chancellor's Office introduced the new 3-unit CSU-GE area F Ethnic Studies. The area was developed to house the new CSU Ethnic Studies graduation requirement. The new requirement is not increasing the 120-graduation unit requirement, but rather CSU-GE area D Social Science has decreased to 6-units from 9 semester units. CCCs can submit existing or new courses in the upcoming CSU GE submission cycle in December 2020, however Ethnic Studies course submissions have a deadline submission of February 5, 2021. Courses submitted may only have an Ethnic Studies prefix other prefix courses can be submitted but only if they are crosslisted to an Ethnic Studies course that is aligned with the Ethnic Studies Student Learning Outcomes. Chancellor's Office Update	<p>Per Assembly Bill (AB) No. 1460: https://leginfo.ca.gov/faces/billTextClient.xhtml?bill_id=201920200AB1460 "Beginning fall 2021, every California State University campus will offer courses in ethnic studies as part of a new requirement in general education in "Area F". This is the first major change in CSU general education in 40 years, recognizing the diversity of our student population as well as the lived history of the state. These courses can encompass one or more of the four traditional ethnic studies groups of Native Americans, African Americans, Asian Americans and Latino and Latina Americans." "In September 2020, the Board of Trustees were informed of a proposal for a Title 5 change for the requirement to be called Ethnic Studies. The Academic Senate of the California State University (ASCSU), as the faculty voice of the CSU, consulted with members of the Ethnic Studies Council as well as members of the CSU Chancellor's Office to finalize core competencies of the new requirement." https://www2.calstate.edu/impact-of-the-csu/diversity/advancement-of-ethnic-studies</p>
