5. Budget/Facilities/Safety/Admin. Services – Steve Kawa	A. <i>Science Center</i> – John Weispfenning’s recent email explanation of why the building will not be available for Spring 2010 is accurate. The building will not receive its Certificate of Occupancy in time. One of the issues is the check of the air system which is a two-week process, critical to this building because of the science labs and use of chemicals. B. <i>Maintenance &amp; Operation Building</i> – the emergency generator is not fully connected. There is also a problem with the general contractor not paying the sub-contractors C. <i>Relocatables</i> - Exercise Science will be able to occupy the S buildings next week D. <i>New construction</i> – the bids for the Humanities Building, gym, parking lot and perimeter road are due in late February for the March Board Meeting. An Observatory and OEC additional parking needs are not reflected on the official Master Plan.</p> <p>Larry Labrado may be proposing a new Bond measure to include those projects from Measure E which were not funded and new projects which will be added to the Master Plan. A facilities committee is working on this new Bond measure list, including estimated costs, so the Board can begin planning the whole area or sub area.</p> <p>Data conversion for CurricuNET began in mid-December and staff is working with the vendor to go live. Training is being scheduled for the Curriculum &amp; Instruction (C&amp;I) Council. Eventually the SCC catalog will be generated from CurricuNET.</p> <p>Eighty (80) classes scheduled for Spring 2010 in the Science Center have been moved to other classrooms. Some of the labs had to be re-scheduled. Registered students will be called and signs will be posted.</p> <p>A. DSPS received a 33.7% reduction to their previous year funding.  B. The new AmeriCorps grant has increased their membership from 25 to 76 members, after making 58 classroom presentations and receiving 655 interest cards. They are looking for new space to accommodate the new students.  C.
