NEW BUSINESS & UPDATES		
1. Showcasing Our Centers (Cindy Partida)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Maureen Roe provided background on the creation of the Centers & Programs (CPC) created last January and explained its goal of bringing together various representatives to pool ideas and develop strategies for making one another and SCC students aware of these services. Cindy Partida provided a presentation on the First Year Support Center (FYSC) and resources available to students, including assistance with: enrolling in classes, applying for a FAFSA, scholarships, California Dream Act, transferring and workshops to enhance skills and ensure students to maximize their success. FYSC works with all other centers (MaSH, STAR, Tutoring Center, Transfer Center, Writing Center, etc.) to connect students to the resources on campus. <p>Group Discussion: (Effective ways to increase awareness to faculty and staff about what services are available to students)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Create a video showcasing and explaining what each center does during Convocation. The videographer who produced the Family Night Support Services video would be used. ○ Partner FYSC with the Transfer Center for classroom presentations. ○ Create a one or two-page poster campaign to post in every classroom. ○ Identify a universal identifying logo for service areas ○ Presentation for department meetings during FLEX week ○ Request faculty to include a link in their syllabus, 	<p>Syed will submit a request to add a presentation to the Fall Convocation.</p> <p>The video will need to be updated to include additional centers and changes.</p>

Student Success data tool (Rudy Tjptahadi)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Rudy Tjptahadi presented additional information about the Student Success data tool available on the Institutional Effectiveness website and demonstrated the interactive options (divisions, departments, subject, etc.). 	
<p>3. Summer Advantage Academy Discussion on assessing our first academy last fall and planning of the next one.</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Summer Advantage Academy will happen for the second time this summer. According to research conducted by Rudy, the Academy benefits students, especially considering that 99.2% of those who completed the program last summer (491) ended up enrolling in Fall 2017 (487), and 92.6% of those persisted in spring. 	
<p>4. Student Equity Update (Joseph Alonzo)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Institutional Assessment is sending out an email regarding a student survey that will take place after spring break. There will be an option to opt out. SCC students will be photographed for new banners to be placed on 30 plus lamp poles, creating a more inviting feel to the college and reflect our student population. The Food Pantry has extended their hours to attract evening students. Dolores Huerta unveiling is scheduled for April 23rd. 	
<p>5. BSI/BSIT Update (Maureen Roe)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The grant is up next year and trying to make sure we are in compliance for AB705. All groups are creating an annual calendar to look at the grant and check our progress. Specifically examining, what areas are we deficit? 	
<p>6. SSSP Credit Updates (Ruth Babeshoff)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Academic probation letters were sent out to 874 students. The deadline to appeal is April 18th. FYSC is contacting students to sign up for probation workshops. Early Welcome orientations will be held on Fridays, beginning April 20th through May 18th. Frank reported a decrease in attendance due to people leaving California and AB540 students are apprehensive to come on campus. 	<p>Forward flyers for Early Welcome folders by April 9th.</p>
<p>7. SSSP Noncredit Update (Rosa Salazar dela Torre)</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The High School Diploma program is marketing its Adult High School Diploma with a career emphasis. The three new Education plans are Business/AHSD HealthCare/AHSD and Technology/AHSD. The three new scholarships for Continuing Ed are DSPS CE student, VP scholarship, and the AB 540 Student Scholarship. 	
<p>8. Other</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Syed reported 85-87% students respond to texting and the need to bring outreach and probation students onboard. The key is to schedule appropriately and create a master calendar. Joseph was at a Region 8 meeting and it looks like the funding is going to be combined next year: SSSP/Student Equity/BSI. All other programs were not. Given to district/colleges for the distribution. Syed will follow up with Rhonda Moore. Will we see cuts in our allocations? 	<p>Syed will invite a financial aid representative to attend future meetings as a guest.</p>
