1. Approval of Prior Minutes from March 5, 2012 2. Priority Registration Statewide Work-Group Update - John Hernandez & Linda Miskovic	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Minutes from the March 5, 2012 meeting were approved</li> <li>John and Linda were nominated to represent their statewide organizations (CSSO's and A &amp; R Officers) to the Chancellor's Office Enrollment Priorities Workgroup. The first meeting was held on March 8, 2012 in Sacramento. The group will make recommendations to the development of a Title 5 regulatory proposal to implement Student Success Task Force Recommendation 3.1, adopting system-wide enrollment priorities that reflect the core mission of community colleges. The group will meet for the third time on April 4. Recommendations will be forwarded to the Board of Governors for their meeting in May. A survey taken by the Chancellor's office in December of 2010 indicated 63% of colleges have a unit cap of 80-100. Linda reported that we show, for Spring 2012, 37 students have completed 100-109 units, 75 have 110+. Discussion ensued regarding setting unit thresholds, what do we need in place and what should be done to implement the process.</li> </ul>	<p>Between now and the first meeting in fall 2012 committee members were asked to research different unit thresholds.</p> <p>Linda will take snapshot of 37 students in the 100-109 unit range and also 35 in 110+ range for the committee to make a comparison.</p>

When administering placement tests to high school students the outreach staff stress that math should be taken through their senior year. 	<p>year. 29 out of 35 did not take a math class before taking the placement test. She also reported that there are 93 different assessment tests in the state and the nature of the test are not good, i.e. multiple choice. It takes 2-3 years to update or change these tests.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• The Little Hoover Commission report was distributed which compares the recommendations of reform proposals between the Commission, 15 recommended, and the Student Success Task Force with 18 recommended. Both recommended 6 out of 27.</li> </ul>
