<p>1. Approval of Prior Minutes from December 10, 2012 2. Joint College Priority Registration Recommendations – John Hernandez 3. Connection by Design – Mary Mettler</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The December 10, 2012 minutes were approved Linda Miskovic gave an overview of the Enrollment Priorities Implementation Group Recommendations. These were approved at the Joint President’s Cabinet meeting on January 15, 2012. Pilot program will begin Fall 2013, full implementation required by law is Fall 2014. Suggestions to further inform students were posters, a statement on the syllabi and the ASG “Hawk Talk” with this information: <i>“New students who have completed college orientation, assessment and developed education plans as well as continuing students in good academic standing who have not exceeded 100 units (not including units in basic English, math or English as a Second Language) will have priority over students who do not meet these criteria. Among these students, active-duty military and veterans and current and former foster youth will continue to have first call on courses, followed by students in Extended Opportunity Programs and Services and Disabled Students Programs and Services.”</i> Mary presented “Connecting to Careers and/or Career Exploration” at the last meeting, She asked for suggestions regarding the issue of advising students on how a career is achieved by the major they choose. Departments could post on websites, “Major of the Month” highlighted on college webpage, majors could be highlighted in the “On Line Orientation” program when implemented. Recommendations should be forwarded to the Academic Senate for further discussion. 	<p>Lisa will bring copies of the handbook which includes careers that relate to English to the next meeting</p>

NEW BUSINESS		
<p>1. Implication for Governor's Proposed Budget - John Hernandez</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> John reviewed several items from the Governor's proposed 2013-14 budget that have implications for students and college funding including a proposal to: (1) require all students seeking BOG fee waivers to complete a FAFSA, (2) limit state supported instruction to 90 units thus charging the full tuition cost, and (3) change census date based apportionment funding to completion rates. This involves adding a second census date at the end of each term. Allow for a five year transition period, after the fifth year funding will be solely based on completion date census. Any loss of apportionment funds would be transferred to student services categorical programs. The LA Times article "Pushing community college reform too far" dated January 27, 2013 was referenced since the article took the position that the Legislature which recently approved community college reforms (SB1456: Student Success Act) should withhold support from the governor's proposals and allow colleges time to implement the recommendations from the Student Success Task Force before adding additional changes.
