Benefits of grants:

- **Be responsive** to student needs by enhancing academic support activities that lead to student success.
- **Opportunity** to provide supplemental learning activities to complement classroom learning.
- **Assist** with the success of students demonstrated by data, the success rates of students who benefit from the special funded projects indicate the value of such services.

Strategies for Grant funded activities:

- Retention
 - Targeted counseling and advisement
 - Learning Communities
 - Peer and faculty mentors
 - Career exploration
- Improved learning (persistence & completion)
 - Supplemental Instruction
 - Tutors
 - Clinical Teaching Assistants
 - Technology for individualized instruction, hands-on and applied learning

Continued...

- Program development to prepare students for employment and transfer (retention, persistence and completion)
 - Curriculum development, and Professional development
 - Tech and equipment upgrades to keep current with industry and IHE instructional standards
 - Internships, undergraduate research, industry tours, speakers' panels
- Regional planning and policy development (enrollment)
 - Programs at the high schools dedicated to preparing students for college enrollment: e.g. Upward Bound Math & Science, Career Pathways Trust, etc.
 - Strengthen pathways to increase student enrollment in CTE through outreach, career exploration activities, pathways development programs, and articulation
