3) Committee Reports / Updates (as related to Enrollment Management)	<p>PIE Committee: Discussed the timeline for submitting Resource Requests and Annual Plans. For this year, annual plan submission will be delayed until all Resource Requests are completed. PIE will be formalizing a new timeline for the college community going forward.</p> <p>Curriculum: CIC approved the first batch of class capacity petitions for Biotech. The form is currently under review for inclusiveness, requests for each modality, parity with contract and union, and the addition of an equity statement. Once CIC approves the petition, the next step is workflow in eLumen. Many courses do not have a number listed for class capacity. SCC is currently working with eLumen to activate this custom field so the data can be reported on the COR.</p>	
4) Fall 2021 Enrollment Update	The committee reviewed the RG0542 report. Fall 2021 Enrollment is down 13% compared to FA2020. Head counts are at 98.83% with recent gains presumed to be due to late start classes. Section counts are down slightly with SCC currently at 94% of what was offered in FA 2020. Average class size went from 29.72 last fall to 27.56 in 2021.	

	<p>SCC experienced budget gains over the last two years, with a significant increase of ~\$1.2million last year. The college has embarked on a massive marketing and outreach effort with a goal of sustained enrollment growth over a long period of time. The State allowed an increase to our net term multiplier for online classes last fiscal year, which generated an increase of 80-90 FTES.</p>	
<p>5) Class Capacity Approval Workflow</p>	<p>There is a step-by-step process that should be followed regarding class capacity. CIC wants to ensure faculty and Deans understand that first the petition has to be approved, then the workflow in eLumen happens.</p> <p>Step 1: Conversation with faculty to talk about class capacity Step 2: Fill out the petition form establishing/amending class capacity Step 3: Discipline faculty consults with Division Dean to reach a mutual agreement. Step 4: Discipline faculty send petition for amending/ establishing class capacity form to CIC office using SCC Curriculum email Step 5: CIC reviews, discusses and votes on each petition for establishing and/or amending class capacity. For historical purposes, all petitions are housed on the H-drive in the Curriculum Office folder Step 6: Approved petitions. Once petitions are approved, the discipline faculty submits a course revision workflow in eLumen. Step 7: Local decision. Class capacity is reflected on course outline of record and entered and/or revised in the Student Information System.</p> <p>Marcelo Pimentel suggested to add an appeal process and inquired if there was a limit to how many courses per year can be reduced or reviewed.</p>

Vision Resource Center – SEM Framework 	<p>Professional Development Gateway – Type Enrollment Management in the search bar to find valuable resources and training materials from the State Chancellor’s Office: CCC – Vision Resource Center</p> <p>The committee reviewed the SEM Institutional Self-Assessment to determine: Are we doing all of these things? Do we have leadership and collaboration around strategic enrollment management, student centered budget model, etc? This will help SCC identify areas where we can improve as an institution or areas that we have not considered before to effectively implement the strategic enrollment management plan EMC will develop by the end of this year.</p>	

	The committee completed approximately half of the self-assessment. A. Voelcker will send out a survey to committee members to complete the remainder of the self-assessment individually and the results will be compiled and shared at the next EMC meeting.
