# **HOW TO APPLY AND REGISTER**

#### STEP ONE:

To apply to Santiago Canyon College, if you <u>did not</u> attend TWO consecutive Full Semester terms (Most recent Fall and Spring), complete an application online at **www.sccollege.edu**. Click on the **APPLY** link. After submitting all of your information, you will receive an email confirmation from Open CCC. Within 1 business day, you will receive an email with your Single Sign-On (student email) login. Within 2 business days, you will receive an email from Santiago Canyon College with orientation, course placement, and registration information. Your registration date will also be posted on Self-Service.

#### **ONLINE REGISTRATION STEPS:**

- 2 Log In with your single sign-on login and password
- 3 On the launch page, click on "Student Planning"
- 4 Type in the courses you want to enroll in under the "Search for courses" bar
- 5 Use filters on the left hand side to filter to location to "Santiago Canyon College" and Terms to "Summer 2023"
- 6 Click on "View Available Sections for..." your course
- 7 When you find a section that you want, click on "Add Section to Schedule"
- 8 A "Section Details" prompt will appear, click "Add Section"
- 9 Do these steps for all of the courses you want to enroll in
- 10 Once you are done, navigate to "Plan & Schedule" under "Student Planning" from the left side menu.
- 11 Make sure you choose the correct term of "Summer 2023"
- 12 When you are on "Schedule" you will be able to view all the courses you selected
- 13 To register for the course, click "Register"

#### **Notice**

- You will lose registration priority if you are on academic probation or progress probation at the end the most recent term.
- You will lose registration priority if you have more than 100 degree applicable units

## **DROP FOR NON-PAYMENT POLICY**

Enrollment fees must be paid IN FULL within 3 days of registration or all of your classes may be dropped and released to other students. The day you register is your first day. If you need assistance paying your enrollment fees and would like to apply for a the California College Promise Grant (formerly known as the BOG Fee Waiver), go to www.cccapply.org/money/california-college-promise-grant . It is your responsibility to check your account balance and pay the amount owed. As a general rule, Summer refunds would only be given if students drop on or before the first class meeting.

## STUDENT RESPONSIBILITY TO DROP CLASSES

To avoid a "W" grade, students must drop classes on or before the day of the first class meeting. Students may not be automatically dropped for non-attendance once the summer session begins. You must drop online. After the first day of the first class meeting, you will not be eligible to receive a refund for your classes nor will you be exempt from enrollment fees. Check drop date online or under section information on each course.

#### WAIT LIST POLICY

You are not able to wait list more than one section of the same course. You cannot Wait List a course that will conflict with another course. As seats become available (before the class starts), students will be moved into an open seat. It is your responsibility to periodically check your class schedule online, or you may lose your place on the Wait List. After being moved in, you will have 3 days to pay for the course or You will have 3 days to pay for the course or You roman remains on the Wait List, you must attend the first class meeting and obtain an add authorization code from the instructor to add the coursein in Self-Service.

#### **PAY FEES IMMEDIATELY**

- **Refunds:** Students will be eligible for a refund if they drop their course on or before the day of the first class meeting.

#### **ACCT 101, FINANCIAL ACCOUNTING**

4.0 UNITS

DATES

The study of accounting as an information system, examining why it is important, and how it is used by investors and creditors to make decisions. Coverage includes the accounting information system and the recording and reporting of business transactions with a focus on the accounting cycle, the application of generally accepted accounting principles, the classified financial statements, and statement analysis. It also includes issues relating to asset, liability, and equity valuation, revenue and expense recognition, cash flow, internal controls and ethics.

Study of the use and reporting of accounting data for managerial planning, cost control, and decisionmaking purposes. The course includes broad coverage of concepts, classifications, and behaviors of costs. Topics include cost systems, the analysis and use of cost information, cost-volume-profit analysis, contribution margin, profit planning, standard costs, relevant costs, and capital budgeting. Prerequisite: Accounting 101.

#### ASL 110. AMERICAN SIGN LANGUAGE I

4.0 UNITS

This entry-level course is designed to introduce students to American Sign Language (ASL) and fingerspelling as it is used within American Deaf culture. Instruction includes preparation for visual/gestural communication followed by intensive work on comprehension through receptive language skills, development of basic conversational skills, modeling of grammatical structures, and general information about American Deaf culture. American Sign Language 110 is equivalent to two years of high school ASL. Students are required to attend at least one off-campus event.

Presents practical and theoretical aspects of medical microbiology to meet the needs of those in allied health professions. Provides basic knowledge of the microbial world by covering diversity, structure, metabolic and genetic characteristics, cultivation and control. Emphasis is placed on human-microbe interactions especially infectious diseases. Laboratory deals with identification, growth, and control of microorganisms. Field trips may be required.



Ramirez Library provides computer (PC/MAC) access to currently enrolled students, in addition to an ADA workstation, phone charging lockers, scanner, and low-cost B/W and color printing. Wi-Fi is available for enrolled students or quests who bring their own Wi-Fi enabled devices. Books, DVDs, CDs, and course reserve textbooks are all available to borrow. The Library features thirteen study rooms in addition to open study areas. Research assistance is available at the Reference Desk, through Ask A Librarian chat, text, and email services, and by scheduling individual consultations. Further instruction is provided through video tutorials, self-paced online workshops, and in class workshops. Library research and digital literacy credit classes are offered most semesters.
