Who May Enroll?

Anyone 18 years old and over can enroll in continuing education classes. Students currently enrolled in high school can attend continuing education classes with special request from their high school and approval from continuing education administration. All classes are tuition free and most classes are openentry/open-exit. Enrollment is on a first-come, first-served basis. Times listed for classes are subject to change without notice from the administration.

Attendance Policy

Students are expected to attend all class meetings. Students who are enrolled and do not attend on the first class session may be dropped.

Textbooks and Supplies

In classes where textbooks are used, instructors will provide information on how students can purchase them.

Class Cancellation Policy

Any class with fewer than 20 students may be canceled.




LEARN A NEW HOBBY, STAY FIT, HAVE FUN

CLASS MODALITIES OFFERED

ON-CAMPUS

This type of class takes place in a classroom, on campus, or at a community site in or around Orange, CA. Refer to list of campuses (page 22)



ONLINE

This class is 100% online. There is not a set class time. You are assigned activities and communicate with your teacher using Canvas, an online learning platform.



REMOTE LIVE (RL)

This is just like an on-campus class but instead of meeting in a classroom each session, you meet on Zoom.





HYBRID

Part of this class takes place on campus at a scheduled time. Part of this class is online. You are assigned activities using Canvas, an online learning platform.





VIRTUAL HYBRID (VH)

Part of this class is on Zoom at a scheduled time. Part of this class takes place online. You are assigned activities using Canvas, an online learning platform.





HYFLEX (Hybrid)

This class is held at one of our campuses or community sites. The classroom has a special camera set up so students can choose to attend class in-person or via Zoom.



The Adult High School Diploma Program at Santiago Canyon College is approved by the California Community Colleges Chancellor's office. Santiago Canyon College is accredited by the Accrediting Commission for the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. Diplomas are issued by the Rancho Santiago Community College District to students who complete the required course of study and demonstrate proficiency in basic skills. Graduation ceremonies are traditionally held each spring.

Earn your high school diploma with Continuing Education! To graduate, you need to earn 160 credits. You get credits by completing courses in subjects like Math, English, Science, and History. You can also receive credits from other sources including:

- Courses completed at another school in the U.S. or abroad
- Work completed with the Armed Forces
- Certain types of work experience

DUAL ENROLLMENT PROGRAM

Students enrolled in the High School Diploma Program at SCC-Continuing Education qualify to take college-level courses to get a head start on college, explore an interest, or fulfill a high school requirement. Students can take courses at the Santiago Canyon College campus, or online. Students be able to earn college credit; explore careers, majors, and interests; strengthen their high school transcripts and academic performance; and save money!

Students also qualify to for free textbooks though this program.

ADULT HIGH SCHOOL DIPLOMA GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

All students are required to complete 160 credits and pass 3 proficiencies to graduate from SCC Continuing Education. A minimum of 20 credits must be completed in residency at Santiago Canyon College. This requires that a student take a minimum of four 5-credit courses. Only one class challenge can be applied for residency requirements.

Challenging Courses By Examination

If you feel you have previously acquired the knowledge in a course needed for graduation, you may earn credits for the class by challenging the course by examination if the course is on the list of approved "Challenge Courses." You may not challenge a course in which you have completed some of the coursework. To challenge a class you must have written approval from your counselor and arrangements will be made with the instructor, according to department policy.

This type of class has no set time. You are provided assignments to be completed on a weekly basis. A

typical online class will require approximately 20 hours per week of work. You can easily connect with your teacher for support via Zoom and on Canvas.
