HOW TO APPLY AND REGISTER

STEP ONE:

To apply to Santiago Canyon College, complete an application online at www.sccollege.edu/apply. After submitting all of your information, you will receive a confirmation email from CCCApply. Within 2 business days, you will receive an email from Santiago Canyon College with your Single Sign-On (student email) login, orientation, course placement, and registration information. Your registration date will be posted on Self-Service. No registration dates will be posted during the open enrollment period.

STEP TWO:

Online Registration is open Monday-Sunday (24/7)

1. Go to sccollege.edu/selfservice
2. Log in with your single sign-on login and password
3. On the launch page, click on "Student Planning".
4. Type in the courses you want to enroll in under the "Search for Courses" bar.
5. Use filters on the left hand side to filter to location "Santiago Canyon College" and Terms to "Intersession 2026".
6. Click on "View Available Section for..." your course.
7. When you find a section that you want, click on "Add Section to Schedule".
8. A "Section Details" prompt will appear, click "Add Section".
9. Repeat these steps for all of the courses you want to enroll in.
10. Once you are finished, navigate to "Plan & Schedule" under "Student Planning" from the left side menu.
11. Make sure you've selected the correct term of "Intersession 2026".
12. When you are on "Schedule" you will be able to view all the courses you selected.
13. To register for the course, click "Register"

DROP FOR NON-PAYMENT POLICY

Enrollment fees must be paid IN FULL within 3 days of registration or all of your classes may be dropped and released to other students. The day you register is your first day. If you need assistance paying your enrollment fees and would like to apply for a Fee Waiver, go to www.cccapply.org/money/california-college-promise-grant. It is your responsibility to check your account balance and pay the amount owed.

Student Responsibility to Drop Classes

To avoid a "W" grade, students must drop classes on or before the day of the first class meeting. Students will not be automatically dropped for non-attendance or non-payment once Intersession begins. You must drop online. After the first day of the first class meeting, you will not be eligible to receive a refund for your classes nor will you be exempt from enrollment fees. Wait List Policy

You are not able to wait list more than one section of the same course. You cannot wait list a course that will conflict with another course. As seats become available, students will be moved into an open seat. **It is your responsibility to periodically check your class schedule online, or you may lose your place on the wait list.** You will be notified by email (it is your responsibility to make sure that your e-mail is up-to-date) **and will have 3 days to pay for the course or you may be dropped.** If your name remains on the wait list, you must attend the first class meeting and obtain an add authorization from the instructor to add the course. You must add under Student Planning. Your add authorization will be valid until the end of the add period.

PAY FEES IMMEDIATELY

Fees must be paid within 3 days of registering for courses or you may be dropped for non-payment. The date that you register counts as the first day. As a general rule, Intersession refunds would only be given if students drop on or before the first class meeting.

- **Refunds:** Students will be eligible for a refund if they drop their course on or before the day of the first class meeting.
- **Pay Online** via Self-Service or **In Person** at the SCC Cashier's Office. Payment by check, Visa, MasterCard, AMEX, and Discover are accepted. Mail checks to SCC Cashier's Office, 8045 E. - **Enrollment Fee** per unit (all students) \$46.00
- **Non-Resident Tuition** per unit \$426.00

(\$352.00 Tuition + \$47.00 Capital Outlay)

- Required of all out-of-state residents (students who have not resided in California for one year), and students who are non U.S. citizens. These fees are in addition to the \$46.00 per unit enrollment fee. Questions regarding residency determination may be referred to the Admissions and Records Office.

A cross-cultural survey of the major areas of cultural anthropology including subsistence patterns, economic and political systems, family and kinship, religion, and cultural change. Also includes contemporary issues facing humankind such as the environment, resource depletion, ethnic conflict, globalization, and warfare. Emphasis is on understanding cultural diversity and cultural universals.

Principles of biology stressing the relationship of all organisms from anatomical, physiological and ecological points of view. Includes cell machinery, genetics, reproduction, embryology, animal behavior, botany, ecology, evolution and human physiology. Designed for non-biology majors.

3.0 UNITS

This course is an integrative approach to personal finance focusing on practical financial decision making as well as the social, psychological, and physiological contexts in which those decisions are made. Students will examine their relationships with money, set personal goals, and develop a plan to meet those goals. Topics include consumerism, debt, health-care, investing, retirement, long-term care, disability, death, and taxes.

4.0 UNITS

This course prepares students for Biology and Chemistry 200 by exploring the basic concepts of matter such as: atomic structure, formulas, equation writing, nomenclature, gases, and kinetic theory. Properties of solutions and the mole concept in quantitative chemistry will be emphasized.

Prerequisite: Qualifying profile from the mathematics placement process.

CHILD DEVELOPMENT (CDEV)

CDEV 107, CHILD GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT (DS1)

3.0 UNITS

This introductory course examines the interactions between maturational processes and environmental factors and the major physical, psychosocial, and cognitive/language developmental milestones for children, both typical and atypical, from conception through adolescence. While studying developmental theory and investigative research methodologies, students will observe children, evaluate individual differences, and analyze characteristics of development at various stages. Field-based assignments may be required. No credit for students who have taken Psychology 157. A negative TB test result and state-mandated immunizations are required for some fieldwork assignments and certificate completion.

Field trips and field-based assignments may be required. A negative TB test result and state-mandated immunizations are required for some fieldwork assignments and certificate completion.
