- These rights transfer to the student when he or she reaches the age of 18 or attends a school beyond the high school level

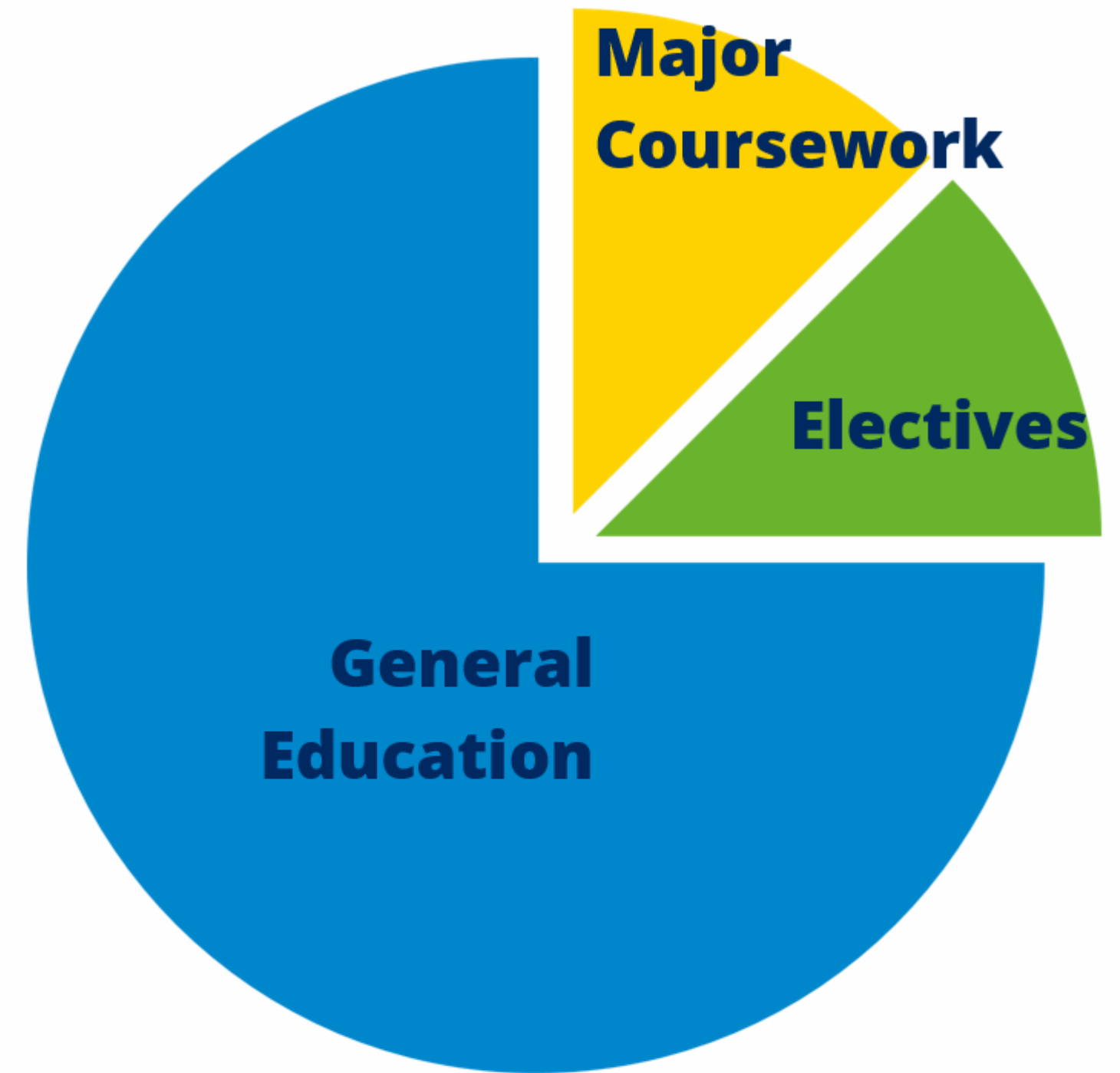

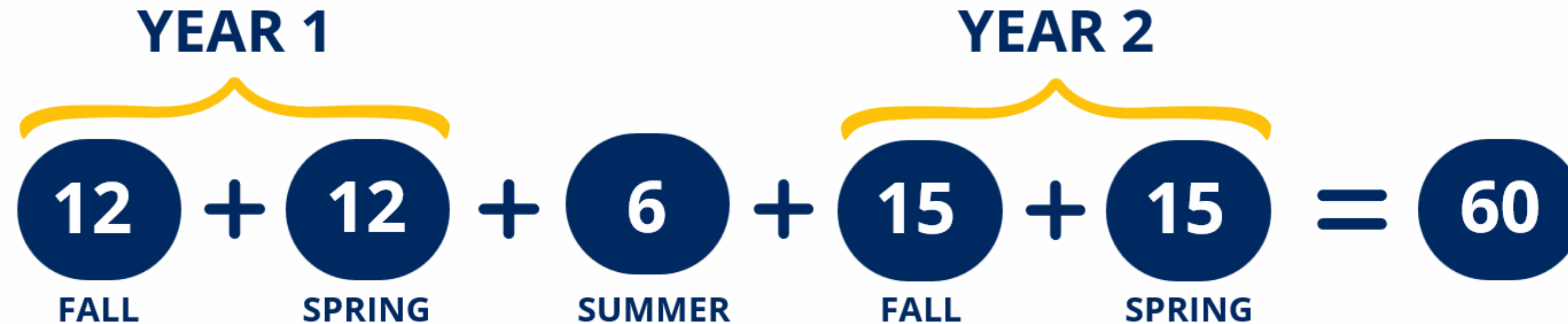

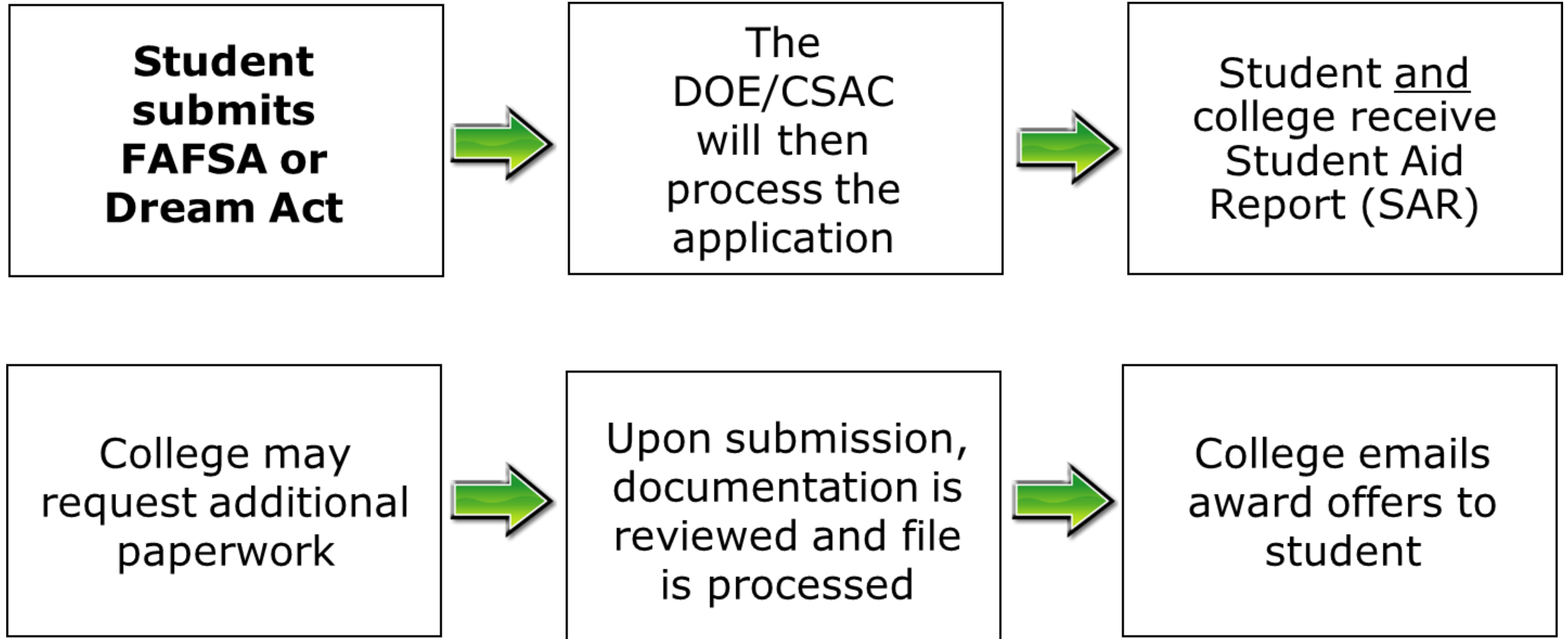




DEPENDENCY STATUS

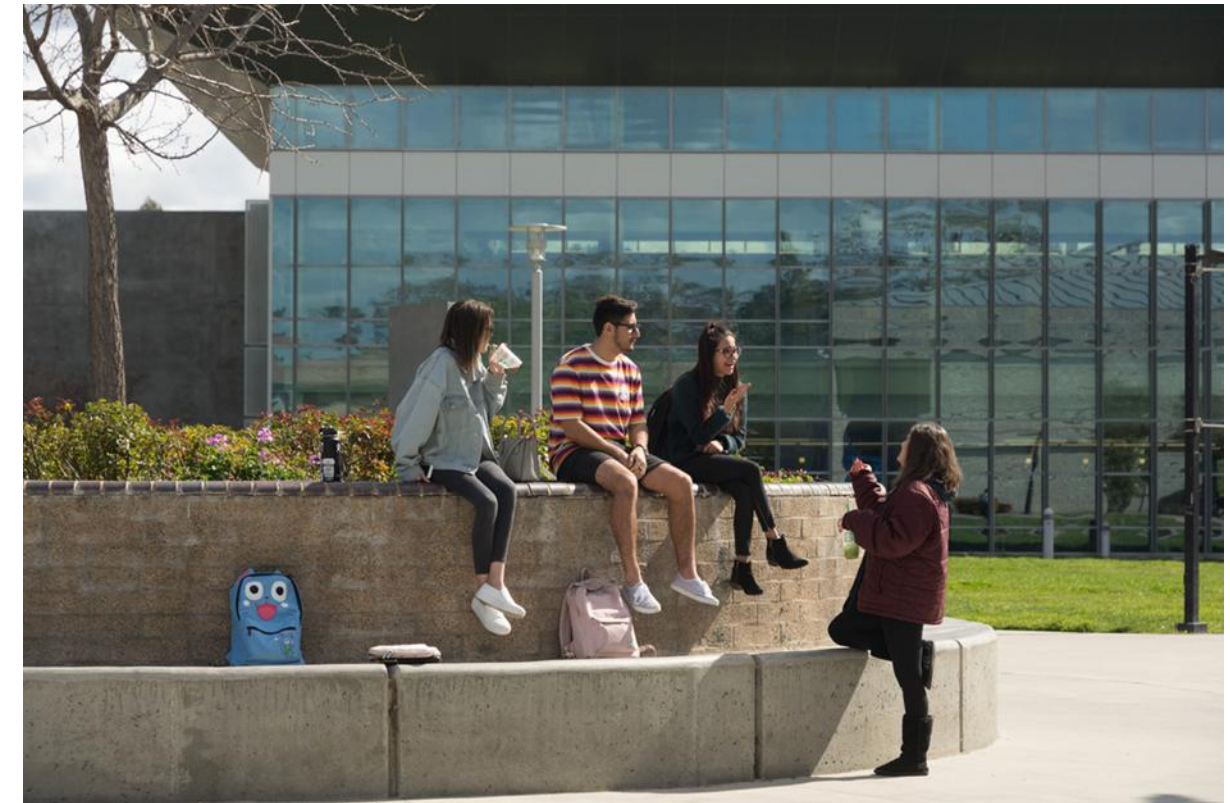
